What was the demand?

The Philippines is one of the most vulnerable and least prepared to deal with the adverse impacts of climate change. We need to raise our collective voice and demand leadership from the G8 countries so that:

- Industrialized countries commit to reduce their greenhouse gas emissions by at least 40% below 1990 levels.
- At least USD 140 billion per annum be committed to support clean energy and other mitigation activities, forest protection and adaptation in developing countries.
- A funding mechanism must be established to end gross deforestation and associated emissions in all developing countries.
- Developing countries should strive to achieve 15-20% deviation from business-asusual growth

(Note this interesting ecological reminder for activists!)

Reminders for GDA

As we aspire for zero-waste events/activities, please be reminded:

- For props, materials, posters, etc, please don't use tarpaulin because it is made of PVC (toxic materials). Use, as much as possible, recycled materials in creating your designs. If you will be using paint, please use non-toxic paints.
